Mauro's other research interests are in the design and synthesis of molecules for specific intermolecular interactions including drug-protein interactions, host-guest interactions, crystal growth modification and corrosion inhibition.

He has received numerous awards for his contributions to learning and teaching, including the inaugural Premier's Prize for Excellence in Science Teaching: Tertiary (2003), the Royal Australian Chemical Institute, Division of Chemical Education Medal (2012) and an Office of Learning and Teaching Australian Award for Programs that Enhance Student Learning (2013).
